<u>Identified Need:</u> Breast cancer is sometimes found after symptoms appear, but many women with breast cancer have no symptoms. This is why regular breast cancer screening is so important. However, confusion exists from disagreement among major guidelines on when to start screening mammograms and how often to have them. Decisions of when to start and end screening and how often to have it should become a shared decision-making between patient and provider following patient discussions of health histories, concerns and preferences surrounding potential harms and benefits of the screening.
